

Vayikra: Vayikra/Leviticus 1:1 - 5:26(6:7)

(Lev 1:1 CJB) Adonai called to Moshe and spoke to him from the tent of meeting. He said,

(Lev 1:2 CJB) "Speak to the people of Isra'el; say to them, 'When any of you brings an offering to Adonai, you may bring your animal offering either from the herd or from the flock.

(Lev 1:3 CJB) If his offering is a burnt offering from the herd, he must offer a male without defect. He is to bring it to the entrance of the tent of meeting, so that it can be accepted by Adonai.

(Lev 1:4 CJB) He is to lay his hand upon the head of the burnt offering, and it will be accepted on his behalf to make atonement for him.

(Lev 1:5 CJB) He is to slaughter the young bull before Adonai; and the sons of Aharon, the cohanim, are to present the blood. They are to splash the blood against all sides of the altar, which is by the entrance to the tent of meeting.

(Lev 1:6 CJB) He is to skin the burnt offering and cut it in pieces.

(Lev 1:7 CJB) The descendants of Aharon the cohen are to put fire on the altar and arrange wood on the fire.

(Lev 1:8 CJB) The sons of Aharon, the cohanim, are to arrange the pieces, the head and the fat on the wood which is on the fire on the altar.

(Lev 1:9 CJB) He is to wash the entrails and lower parts of the legs with water, and the cohen is to cause all of it to go up in smoke on the altar as a burnt offering; it is an offering made by fire, a fragrant aroma for Adonai.

(Lev 1:10 CJB) " 'If his offering is from the flock, whether from the sheep or from the goats, for a burnt offering, he must offer a male without defect.

(Lev 1:11 CJB) He is to slaughter it on the north side of the altar before Adonai; and the sons of Aharon, the cohanim, are to splash its blood against all sides of the altar.

(Lev 1:12 CJB) He is to cut it into pieces, and the cohen is to arrange them with the head and fat on the wood which is on the fire on the altar.

(Lev 1:13 CJB) He is to wash the entrails and lower parts of the legs with water; and the cohen is to offer it all and make it go up in smoke on the altar as a burnt offering; it is an offering made by fire, a fragrant aroma for Adonai.

(Lev 1:14 CJB) " 'If his offering to Adonai is a burnt offering of birds, he must offer a dove or a young pigeon.

(Lev 1:15 CJB) The cohen is to bring it to the altar, snap off its head and make it go up in smoke on the altar; its blood is to be drained out on the side of the altar.

(Lev 1:16 CJB) He is to remove the food pouch and its feathers from its neck and discard it on the pile of ashes just east of the altar.

(Lev 1:17 CJB) He is to pull it open with a wing on each side, but without tearing it in half. The cohen is to make it go up in smoke on the altar, on the wood which is on the fire, as a burnt offering; it is an offering made by fire, a fragrant aroma for Adonai.

(Lev 2:1 CJB) " 'Anyone who brings a grain offering to Adonai is to make his offering of fine flour; he is to pour olive oil on it and put frankincense on it.

(Lev 2:2 CJB) He is to bring it to the sons of Aharon, the cohanim. The cohen is to take a handful of fine flour from it, together with its olive oil and all its frankincense, and make this reminder portion go up in smoke on the altar as an offering made by fire, a fragrant aroma for Adonai.

(Lev 2:3 CJB) But the rest of the grain offering will belong to Aharon and his sons; it is an especially holy part of the offerings for Adonai made by fire.

(Lev 2:4 CJB) " 'When you bring a grain offering which has been baked in the oven, it is to consist of either unleavened cakes made of fine flour mixed with olive oil or matzah spread with olive oil.

(Lev 2:5 CJB) If your offering is a grain offering cooked on a griddle, it is to consist of unleavened fine flour mixed with olive oil;

(Lev 2:6 CJB) you are to break it in pieces and pour olive oil on it — it is a grain offering.

(Lev 2:7 CJB) If your offering is a grain offering cooked in a pot, it is to consist of fine flour with olive oil.

(Lev 2:8 CJB) " 'You are to bring the grain offering prepared in any of these ways to Adonai ; it is to be presented to the cohen, and he is to bring it to the altar.

(Lev 2:9 CJB) The cohen is to remove the reminder portion of the grain offering and make it go up in smoke on the altar as an offering made by fire, a fragrant aroma for Adonai.

(Lev 2:10 CJB) But the rest of the grain offering will belong to Aharon and his sons; it is an especially holy part of the offerings for Adonai made by fire.

(Lev 2:11 CJB) " 'No grain offering that you bring to Adonai is to be made with leaven, because you are not to cause any leaven or honey to go up in smoke as an offering made by fire to Adonai.

(Lev 2:12 CJB) As an offering of firstfruits you may bring these to Adonai, but they are not to be brought up onto the altar to make a fragrant aroma.

(Lev 2:13 CJB) You are to season every grain offering of yours with salt — do not omit from your grain offering the salt of the covenant with your God, but offer salt with all your offerings.

(Lev 2:14 CJB) " 'If you bring a grain offering of firstfruits to Adonai, you are to bring as the grain offering from your firstfruits kernels of grain from fresh ears, dry-roasted with fire.

(Lev 2:15 CJB) Put olive oil on it, and lay frankincense on it; it is a grain offering.

(Lev 2:16 CJB) The cohen is to cause the reminder portion of it, its grits and olive oil, with all its frankincense, to go up in smoke; it is an offering made by fire for Adonai.

(Lev 3:1 CJB) " 'If his offering is a sacrifice of peace offerings, then, if he offers before Adonai an animal from the herd, then, no matter whether it is male or female, it must be without defect.

(Lev 3:2 CJB) He is to lay his hand on the head of his offering and slaughter it at the entrance to the tent of meeting; and the sons of Aharon, the cohanim, are to splash the blood against all sides of the altar.

(Lev 3:3 CJB) He is to present the sacrifice of the peace offerings as an offering made by fire to Adonai; it is to consist of the fat covering the inner organs, all the fat above the inner organs,

(Lev 3:4 CJB) the two kidneys, the fat on them near the flanks, and the covering of the liver, which he will remove with the kidneys.

(Lev 3:5 CJB) Aharon's sons will make it go up in smoke on the altar on top of the burnt offering which is on the wood on the fire; it is an offering made by fire, a fragrant aroma for Adonai.

(Lev 3:6 CJB) " 'If his offering for a sacrifice of peace offerings to Adonai is from the flock, then, when he offers it, no matter whether it is male or female, it must be without defect.

(Lev 3:7 CJB) If he brings a lamb for his offering, then he is to present it before Adonai.

(Lev 3:8 CJB) He is to lay his hand on the head of his offering and slaughter it at the entrance to the tent of meeting, and the sons of Aharon are to splash its blood against all sides of the altar.

(Lev 3:9 CJB) From the sacrifices made as peace offerings, he is to present Adonai with an offering made by fire; it is to consist of its fat, the entire fat tail, which he will remove close to the lower backbone, the fat covering the inner organs, all the fat above the inner organs,

(Lev 3:10 CJB) the two kidneys, the fat on them near the flanks, and the covering of the liver, which he will remove with the kidneys.

(Lev 3:11 CJB) The cohen will make it go up in smoke on the altar; it is food, an offering made by fire to Adonai.

(Lev 3:12 CJB) " 'If his offering is a goat, then he is to present it before Adonai.

(Lev 3:13 CJB) He is to lay his hand on its head and slaughter it in front of the tent of meeting, and the sons of Aharon are to splash its blood against all sides of the altar.

(Lev 3:14 CJB) He is to present from it his offering, an offering made by fire to Adonai ; it is to consist of the fat covering the inner organs, all the fat above the inner organs,

(Lev 3:15 CJB) the two kidneys, the fat on them near the flanks, and the covering of the liver, which he will remove with the kidneys.

(Lev 3:16 CJB) The cohen will make them go up in smoke on the altar; it is food, an offering made by fire to be a fragrant aroma; all the fat belongs to Adonai.

(Lev 3:17 CJB) It is to be a permanent regulation through all your generations wherever you live that you will eat neither fat nor blood.' "

(Lev 4:1 CJB) Adonai said to Moshe,

(Lev 4:2 CJB) "Tell the people of Isra'el: 'If anyone sins inadvertently against any of the mitzvot of Adonai concerning things which should not be done, if he does any one of them,

(Lev 4:3 CJB) then, if it is the anointed cohen who sinned and thus brought guilt on the people, he is to offer Adonai a young bull without defect as a sin offering for the sin he committed.

(Lev 4:4 CJB) He must bring the bull to the entrance of the tent of meeting before Adonai, lay his hand on the bull's head and slaughter the bull in the presence of Adonai.

(Lev 4:5 CJB) The anointed cohen is to take some of the bull's blood and bring it to the tent of meeting.

(Lev 4:6 CJB) The cohen is to dip his finger in the blood and sprinkle some of the blood seven times in the presence of Adonai in front of the curtain of the sanctuary.

(Lev 4:7 CJB) The cohen is to put some of the blood on the horns of the altar for fragrant incense before Adonai there in the tent of meeting. All the remaining blood

of the bull he is to pour out at the base of the altar for burnt offerings, which is at the entrance to the tent of meeting.

(Lev 4:8 CJB) He is to remove from the bull for the sin offering all of its fat — the fat covering the inner organs, all the fat above the inner organs,

(Lev 4:9 CJB) the two kidneys, the fat on them near the flanks, and the covering of the liver, which he will remove with the kidneys

(Lev 4:10 CJB) as it is removed from an ox sacrificed as a peace offering; and the cohen is to make these parts go up in smoke on the altar for burnt offerings.

(Lev 4:11 CJB) But the bull's hide and all its flesh, with its head, the lower parts of its legs, its inner organs and dung —

(Lev 4:12 CJB) in other words, the entire bull — he is to bring outside the camp to a clean place, where the ashes are emptied out. There he is to burn it on wood with fire; there, where the ashes are emptied out, it is to be burned up.

(Lev 4:13 CJB) " 'If the entire community of Isra'el inadvertently makes a mistake, with the assembly being unaware of the matter, and they do something against any of the mitzvot of Adonai concerning things which should not be done, they are guilty.

(Lev 4:14 CJB) When the sin they have committed becomes known, then the assembly is to offer a young bull as a sin offering and bring it before the tent of meeting.

(Lev 4:15 CJB) The leaders of the community are to lay their hands on the bull's head and slaughter the bull in the presence of Adonai.

(Lev 4:16 CJB) The anointed cohen is to bring some of the bull's blood to the tent of meeting.

(Lev 4:17 CJB) The cohen is to dip his finger in the blood and sprinkle it seven times in the presence of Adonai in front of the curtain.

(Lev 4:18 CJB) He is to put some of the blood on the horns of the altar before Adonai, there in the tent of meeting. All the remaining blood he is to pour out at the base of the altar for burnt offerings, which is at the entrance to the tent of meeting.

(Lev 4:19 CJB) He is to remove all its fat and make it go up in smoke on the altar.

(Lev 4:20 CJB) This is what he is to do with the bull — he must do the same with this bull as he does with the one for the sin offering. Thus the cohen will make atonement for them, and they will be forgiven.

(Lev 4:21 CJB) He is to bring the bull outside the camp and burn it as he burned the first bull; it is the sin offering for the assembly.

(Lev 4:22 CJB) " 'When a leader sins and inadvertently does something against any of the mitzvot of Adonai concerning things which should not be done, he is guilty.

(Lev 4:23 CJB) If the sin which he committed becomes known to him, he is to bring as his offering a male goat without defect,

(Lev 4:24 CJB) lay his hand on the goat's head and slaughter it in the place where they slaughter the burnt offering in the presence of Adonai ; it is a sin offering.

(Lev 4:25 CJB) The cohen is to take some of the blood of the sin offering with his finger and put it on the horns of the altar for burnt offerings. Its remaining blood he is to pour out at the base of the altar for burnt offerings.

(Lev 4:26 CJB) All its fat he is to make go up in smoke on the altar, like the fat of the sacrifice for peace offerings; thus the cohen will make atonement for him in regard to his sin, and he will be forgiven.

(Lev 4:27 CJB) " 'If an individual among the people commits a sin inadvertently, doing something against any of the mitzvot of Adonai concerning things which should not be done, he is guilty.

(Lev 4:28 CJB) If the sin he committed becomes known to him, he is to bring as his offering a female goat without defect for the sin he committed,

(Lev 4:29 CJB) lay his hand on the head of the sin offering and slaughter the sin offering in the place of burnt offerings.

(Lev 4:30 CJB) The cohen is to take some of its blood with his finger and put it on the horns of the altar for burnt offerings. All its remaining blood he is to pour out at the base of the altar.

(Lev 4:31 CJB) All its fat he is to remove, as the fat is removed from the sacrifice for peace offerings; and the cohen is to make it go up in smoke on the altar as a fragrant aroma for Adonai. Thus the cohen will make atonement for him, and he will be forgiven.

(Lev 4:32 CJB) " 'If he brings a lamb as his sin offering, he is to bring a female without defect,

(Lev 4:33 CJB) lay his hand on the head of the sin offering and slaughter it as a sin offering in the place where they slaughter burnt offerings.

(Lev 4:34 CJB) The cohen is to take some of the blood of the sin offering with his finger and put it on the horns of the altar for burnt offerings. All its remaining blood he is to pour out at the base of the altar.

(Lev 4:35 CJB) All its fat he is to remove, as the fat of a lamb is removed from the sacrifice for peace offerings; and the cohen is to make it go up in smoke on the altar

on top of the offerings for Adonai made by fire. Thus the cohen will make atonement for him in regard to the sin he committed, and he will be forgiven.

(Lev 5:1 CJB) " ' If a person who is a witness, sworn to testify, sins by refusing to tell what he has seen or heard about the matter, he must bear the consequences.

(Lev 5:2 CJB) If a person touches something unclean, whether the carcass of an unclean wild animal, a domestic animal or a reptile, he is guilty, even though he may not be aware that he is unclean.

(Lev 5:3 CJB) If he touches some human uncleanness, no matter what the source of his uncleanness is, and is unaware of it, then, when he learns of it, he is guilty.

(Lev 5:4 CJB) If someone allows to slip from his mouth an oath to do evil or to do good, and he doesn't remember that he clearly spoke this oath, then, no matter what it was about, when he learns of it, he is guilty.

(Lev 5:5 CJB) A person guilty of any of these things is to confess in what manner he sinned

(Lev 5:6 CJB) and bring his guilt offering to Adonai for the sin he committed; it is to be a female from the flock, either a lamb or a goat, as a sin offering; and the cohen will make atonement for him in regard to his sin.

(Lev 5:7 CJB) " 'If he can't afford a lamb, he is to bring as his guilt offering for the sin he committed two doves or two young pigeons for Adonai — the one as a sin offering and the other as a burnt offering.

(Lev 5:8 CJB) He is to bring them to the cohen, who will offer the one for a sin offering first. He is to wring its neck but not remove the head,

(Lev 5:9 CJB) sprinkle some of the blood of the sin offering on the side of the altar and drain out the rest of the blood at the base of the altar; it is a sin offering.

(Lev 5:10 CJB) He is to prepare the second as a burnt offering in the manner prescribed. Thus the cohen will make atonement for him in regard to the sin which he committed, and he will be forgiven.

(Lev 5:11 CJB) " 'But if his means are insufficient even for two doves or two young pigeons, then he is to bring as his offering for the sin he committed two quarts of fine flour for a sin offering; he is not to put any olive oil or frankincense on it, because it is a sin offering.

(Lev 5:12 CJB) He is to bring it to the cohen, and the cohen is to take a handful of it as its reminder portion and make it go up in smoke on the altar on top of the offerings for Adonai made by fire; it is a sin offering.

(Lev 5:13 CJB) Thus the cohen will make atonement for him in regard to the sin he committed concerning any of these things, and he will be forgiven. The rest will belong to the cohanim, as with a grain offering.' "

(Lev 5:14 CJB) Adonai said to Moshe,

(Lev 5:15 CJB) "If anyone acts improperly and inadvertently sins in regard to the holy things of Adonai, he is to bring as his guilt offering for Adonai a ram without defect from the flock or its equivalent in silver shekels (using the sanctuary shekel as the standard), according to your appraisal of its value; it is a guilt offering.

(Lev 5:16 CJB) In addition, he is to make restitution for whatever he did wrong in regard to the holy thing; moreover, he is to add to that one-fifth and give it to the cohen. Then the cohen will make atonement with the ram of the guilt offering, and he will be forgiven.

(Lev 5:17 CJB) "If someone sins by doing something against any of the mitzvot of Adonai concerning things which should not be done, he is guilty, even if he is unaware of it; and he bears the consequences of his wrongdoing.

(Lev 5:18 CJB) He must bring a ram without defect from the flock, or its equivalent according to your appraisal, to the cohen for a guilt offering; the cohen will make atonement concerning the error which he committed, even though he was unaware of it; and he will be forgiven.

(Lev 5:19 CJB) It is a guilt offering — he is certainly guilty before Adonai."

(Lev 6:1 CJB) (5:20) Adonai said to Moshe,

(Lev 6:2 CJB) (5:21) "If someone sins and acts perversely against Adonai by dealing falsely with his neighbor in regard to a deposit or security entrusted to him, by stealing from him, by extorting him,

(Lev 6:3 CJB) (5:22) or by dealing falsely in regard to a lost object he has found, or by swearing to a lie — if a person commits any of these sins,

(Lev 6:4 CJB) (5:23) then, if he sinned and is guilty, he is to restore whatever it was he stole or obtained by extortion, or whatever was deposited with him, or the lost object which he found,

(Lev 6:5 CJB) (5:24) or anything about which he has sworn falsely. He is to restore it in full plus an additional one-fifth; he must return it to the person who owns it, on the day when he presents his guilt offering.

(Lev 6:6 CJB) (5:25) He is to bring as his guilt offering to Adonai a ram without defect from the flock, or its equivalent according to your appraisal, to the cohen; it is a guilt offering.

(Lev 6:7 CJB) (5:26) Thus the cohen will make atonement for him before Adonai, and he will be forgiven in regard to whatever it was he did that made him guilty

Haftarah Vayikra: Yesha'yahu (Isaiah) 43:21-44:23

(Isa 43:21 CJB) the people I formed for myself, so that they would proclaim my praise.

(Isa 43:22 CJB) But you haven't called on me, Ya`akov; because you have grown weary of me, Isra'el.

(Isa 43:23 CJB) You have not brought me sheep for your burnt offerings, you have not honored me with your sacrifices. I didn't burden you by requiring grain offerings. or weary you by demanding frankincense.

(Isa 43:24 CJB) You have not spent money to buy me sweet cane or filled me with the fat of your sacrifices. Instead, you have burdened me with your sins and wearied me with your crimes.

(Isa 43:25 CJB) I, yes I, am the one who blots out your offenses for my own sake; I will not remember your sins.

(Isa 43:26 CJB) Remind me when we're in court together — tell your side, make the case that you are right.

(Isa 43:27 CJB) Your first father sinned, and your spokesmen rebelled against me.

(Isa 43:28 CJB) Therefore I repudiated the officials of the sanctuary, delivered Ya`akov to the curse of destruction, and subjected Isra'el to scorn.

(Isa 44:1 CJB) "Now listen, Ya`akov my servant, Isra'el whom I have chosen:

(Isa 44:2 CJB) Thus says Adonai, who made you, formed you in the womb, and will help you: Don't be afraid, Ya`akov my servant, Yeshurun, whom I have chosen.

(Isa 44:3 CJB) For I will pour water on the thirsty land and streams on the dry ground; I will pour my Spirit on your descendants, my blessing on your offspring.

(Isa 44:4 CJB) They will spring up among the grass like willows on the riverbanks.

(Isa 44:5 CJB) One will say, 'I belong to Adonai.' Another will be called by the name of Ya`akov. Yet another will write that he belongs to Adonai. and adopt the surname Isra'el."

(Isa 44:6 CJB) Thus says Adonai, Isra'el's King and Redeemer, Adonai-Tzva'ot: "I am the first, and I am the last; besides me there is no God.

(Isa 44:7 CJB) Who is like me? Let him speak out! Let him show me clearly what has been happening since I set up the eternal people; let him foretell future signs and events.

(Isa 44:8 CJB) Don't be frightened, don't be afraid — Didn't I tell you this long ago? I foretold it, and you are my witnesses. Is there any God besides me? There is no other Rock — I know of none."

(Isa 44:9 CJB) All idol-makers amount to nothing; their precious productions profit no one; and their witnesses, to their own shame, neither see nor understand.

(Isa 44:10 CJB) Who would fashion a god or cast an image that profits no one anything?

(Isa 44:11 CJB) All involved will be ashamed, but more than anyone else, the people who made them. Let them all be assembled, let them stand up; let them fear and be shamed together.

(Isa 44:12 CJB) A blacksmith makes a tool over burning coals; with his strong arm he shapes it with hammers. But when he gets hungry, his strength fails; if he doesn't drink water, he grows tired.

(Isa 44:13 CJB) A carpenter takes his measurements, sketches the shape with a stylus, planes the wood, checks it with calipers, and carves it into the shape of a man; and, since it is honored like a man, of course it has to live in a house.

(Isa 44:14 CJB) He goes to chop down cedars; he takes an evergreen and an oak; he especially tends one tree in the forest, plants a pine for the rain to nourish.

(Isa 44:15 CJB) In time, when it's ready for use as fuel, he takes some of it to keep himself warm and burns some more to bake bread. Then he makes a god and worships it, carves it into an idol and falls down before it.

(Isa 44:16 CJB) So half of it he burns in the fire; with that half he roasts meat and eats his fill; he warms himself; says, "It feels so good, getting warm while watching the flames!"

(Isa 44:17 CJB) With the rest of the log he fashions a god, a carved image, then falls down before it; he worships it and prays to it. "Save me," he says, "for you are my god!"

(Isa 44:18 CJB) Such people know nothing, understand nothing. Their eyes are sealed shut, so that they can't see; their hearts too, so they can't understand.

(Isa 44:19 CJB) Not one thinks to himself or has the knowledge or the discernment to say, "I burned half of it in the fire, baked bread on its coals, roasted meat and ate

it. Should I now make the rest an abomination? Should I prostrate myself to a tree trunk?"

(Isa 44:20 CJB) He is relying on ashes! A deceived heart has led him astray; so that now he won't save himself, just won't say, "This thing in my hand is a fraud!"

(Isa 44:21 CJB) "Keep these matters in mind, Ya`akov, for you, Isra'el, are my servant. I formed you, you are my own servant; Isra'el, don't forget me.

(Isa 44:22 CJB) Like a thick cloud, I wipe away your offenses; like a cloud, your sins. Come back to me, for I have redeemed you."

(Isa 44:23 CJB) Sing, you heavens, for Adonai has done it! Shout, you depths of the earth! Mountains, break out into song, along with every tree in the forest! For Adonai has redeemed Ya`akov; he glorifies himself in Isra'el.

B'rit Hadashah suggested readings for Parashah Vayikra: Romans 8:1-13; Messianic Jews (Hebrews) 10:1-14; 13:10-16

(Rom 8:1 CJB) Therefore, there is no longer any condemnation awaiting those who are in union with the Messiah Yeshua.

(Rom 8:2 CJB) Why? Because the Torah of the Spirit, which produces this life in union with Messiah Yeshua, has set me free from the "Torah" of sin and death.

(Rom 8:3 CJB) For what the Torah could not do by itself, because it lacked the power to make the old nature cooperate, God did by sending his own Son as a human being with a nature like our own sinful one [*but without sin*]. God did this in order to deal with sin, and in so doing he executed the punishment against sin in human nature,

(Rom 8:4 CJB) so that the just requirement of the Torah might be fulfilled in us who do not run our lives according to what our old nature wants but according to what the Spirit wants.

(Rom 8:5 CJB) For those who identify with their old nature set their minds on the things of the old nature, but those who identify with the Spirit set their minds on the things of the Spirit.

(Rom 8:6 CJB) Having one's mind controlled by the old nature is death, but having one's mind controlled by the Spirit is life and shalom.

(Rom 8:7 CJB) For the mind controlled by the old nature is hostile to God, because it does not submit itself to God's Torah — indeed, it cannot.

(Rom 8:8 CJB) Thus, those who identify with their old nature cannot please God.

(Rom 8:9 CJB) But you, you do not identify with your old nature but with the Spirit — provided the Spirit of God is living inside you, for anyone who doesn't have the Spirit of the Messiah doesn't belong to him.

(Rom 8:10 CJB) However, if the Messiah is in you, then, on the one hand, the body is dead because of sin; but, on the other hand, the Spirit is giving life because God considers you righteous.

(Rom 8:11 CJB) And if the Spirit of the One who raised Yeshua from the dead is living in you, then the One who raised the Messiah Yeshua from the dead will also give life to your mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

(Rom 8:12 CJB) So then, brothers, we don't owe a thing to our old nature that would require us to live according to our old nature.

(Rom 8:13 CJB) For if you live according to your old nature, you will certainly die; but if, by the Spirit, you keep putting to death the practices of the body, you will live.

(Heb 10:1 CJB) For the Torah has in it a shadow of the good things to come, but not the actual manifestation of the originals. Therefore, it can never, by means of the same sacrifices repeated endlessly year after year, bring to the goal those who approach the Holy Place to offer them.

(Heb 10:2 CJB) Otherwise, wouldn't the offering of those sacrifices have ceased? For if the people performing the service had been cleansed once and for all, they would no longer have sins on their conscience.

(Heb 10:3 CJB) No, it is quite the contrary — in these sacrifices is a reminder of sins, year after year.

(Heb 10:4 CJB) For it is impossible that the blood of bulls and goats should take away sins.

(Heb 10:5 CJB) This is why, on coming into the world, he says, "It has not been your will to have an animal sacrifice and a meal offering; rather, you have prepared for me a body.

(Heb 10:6 CJB) No, you have not been pleased with burnt offerings and sin offerings.

(Heb 10:7 CJB) Then I said, 'Look! In the scroll of the book it is written about me. I have come to do your will.' "

(Heb 10:8 CJB) In saying first, "You neither willed nor were pleased with animal sacrifices, meal offerings, burnt offerings and sin offerings," things which are offered in accordance with the Torah;

(Heb 10:9 CJB) and then, "Look, I have come to do your will"; he takes away the first system in order to set up the second.

(Heb 10:10 CJB) It is in connection with this will that we have been separated for God and made holy, once and for all, through the offering of Yeshua the Messiah's body.

(Heb 10:11 CJB) Now every cohen stands every day doing his service, offering over and over the same sacrifices, which can never take away sins.

(Heb 10:12 CJB) But this one, after he had offered for all time a single sacrifice for sins, sat down at the right hand of God,

(Heb 10:13 CJB) from then on to wait until his enemies be made a footstool for his feet.

(Heb 10:14 CJB) For by a single offering he has brought to the goal for all time those who are being set apart for God and made holy.

(Heb 13:10 CJB) We have an altar from which those who serve in the Tent are not permitted to eat.

(Heb 13:11 CJB) For the cohen hagadol brings the blood of animals into the Holiest Place as a sin offering, but their bodies are burned outside the camp.

(Heb 13:12 CJB) So too Yeshua suffered death outside the gate, in order to make the people holy through his own blood.

(Heb 13:13 CJB) Therefore, let us go out to him who is outside the camp and share his disgrace.

(Heb 13:14 CJB) For we have no permanent city here; on the contrary, we seek the one to come.

(Heb 13:15 CJB) Through him, therefore, let us offer God a sacrifice of praise continually. For this is the natural product of lips that acknowledge his name.

(Heb 13:16 CJB) But don't forget doing good and sharing with others, for with such sacrifices God is well pleased.
